

The CBE has introduced a new student supplies fee for elementary students.

This year's **fee for Kindergarten students is \$20.00** and can be paid through your MyCBE/Powerschool account. Throughout the year, there will be additional fees for fieldtrips. NO Cash is accepted.

You do not need to send any supplies with your child to school. The \$20 covers all markers, paper, notebooks etc.


We ask you to leave the following information on the message:

Enhanced Supports

The classroom teacher is at the centre of your child's learning team and is supported by a school learning team. Based on classroom needs, each kindergarten program will also be supported by a multidisciplinary team that works with large and small groups in the classroom.

 - Early Learning Strategists
 - Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs)
 - Psychologists
 - Occupational Therapists (OTs)
 - Physiotherapists (PTs)
 - School Family Liaison (SFL)

How can I help my child get ready for September?








Visit the Public Library. Find some books about going to school. Talk to your child about how they are feeling.

Help your child to recognize and print their first name.

Provide opportunities for your child to practice opening and closing their snack containers.

Have your child practice putting on their jacket and shoes. Don't forget to practice zippers and buttons
